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About Writing Coaches of Montana

Since its inception in 1995, Writing Coaches of Montana (WCM) has grown from an on-site drop-in center in a single, Missoula school, to a classroom-based, teacherdriven program across western Montana. Historically, we serve Flathead, Missoula, and Ravalli counties. We expect WCM's impact to grow as the organization aims to expand into a state-wide organization.

At the invitation of teachers, trained coaches meet individually with every student in the classroom. Coaches work with students in grades 4-12 across disciplines. WCM uses communication techniques which help students deepen their critical thinking and learn how to develop their writing and revision process.

WRITING ACROSS DISCIPLINES

Coaches supported students in government, social studies, language arts, and humanities classes, partnering with **33 teachers.** For the first time, coaches worked with an entire class of English Language Learners!

OVER 1,000 HOURS VOLUNTEERED

Hundreds of local community members donated over 1,000 hours working with students in **3,148 sessions**. That equates to **\$15,920** of in-kind labor!
