This is the document that you will use to gather background information for your collaborative research project between ELA and Social Studies class. The first source (your textbook) will be used to gather background information on your topic, focusing on who, what, where, when, why, and how questions. The last source you will find and cite on your own, once you build your research questions and thesis statement.

Book Citation Example:

Last name, First name. *Title*. Publishing Company, Copyright date.

On-line Citation Example:

Author or editor's name. "Title of Article". *Name of website*, date of resource creation (if available), URL. Date of access.

In-Text Citation Example:

The author's last name and the page number(s) from which the quotation/paraphrase is taken must appear in the text. The author's name may appear either in the sentence itself or in parentheses following the quotation/paraphrase.

- Garcia describes the Backcountry as "the land to the West of the English Colonies" (126).
- The Backcountry is the land further inland of the British Colonies (Garcia, et al.126).
