Revision Checklist for Story

Beginning - Background

Are the main characters and setting introduced in the beginning?
Is background information given that is needed for the story?
What is the main problem (or main idea) in the story?
Middle – Rising Action and Climax
Does the sequence of events make sense?
Does the writer stick to the topic and not go off track?
Is there enough narration and not too much dialogue?
Is there a climax or high point in the story? What is it?
Ending – Falling Action and Resolution
After the alimax, do the falling action events wron up the problem in the story?

After the climax, do the falling action events wrap up the problem in the story?

Does the story come to a satisfying ending or resolution?

Are all important questions the reader may have resolved by the end?

Word Choice

Are transitions used where needed to make the story flow and make sense? Transitions are important especially when the events change or the setting changes. Transitions are often used at the beginning of paragraphs.

Are interesting and descriptive words used (adjectives, adverbs, verbs, nouns)?

Are there too many plain words from the "Find a Better Word List?" (Find them and change them to something better.)

Is figurative language at least once? (simile, metaphor, personification, onomatopoeia, alliteration, hyperbole, idiom) You don't have to have each kind, just some kind of figurative language at least once in the story.

Are words repeated too often? (Check the beginnings of your sentences and make sure you're not starting with the same word all of the time. Replace the characters' names with pronouns sometimes instead of repeating the name all of the time.)

Are other words used besides "said" (yelled, exclaimed, shouted, whispered, etc.) in the speech tags sometimes?

Sentence Fluency

Do the sentences start with a variety of words? (Read the first word in each sentence and make sure you are not repeating too much.)

Do the sentences vary in length? (Count the number of words in each sentence and then read the numbers to make sure you do have a variety of lengths.)

Read your story out loud to someone. Does it flow smoothly?

Presentation

Is the heading done correctly in the right hand corner? (Name - first and last, capitalized correctly, Date, Period)

Is the title capitalized correctly? (first word, last word, and all important words) (Do not capitalize articles or small prepositions unless they are the first or last word)

Are all paragraphs indented?

Is the story long enough? Does it have a definite beginning, middle, and end?

Is the whole story double spaced except for the heading?

Is the final draft the regular font and color?

Is there anything extra to earn a 4? _____ (nearly perfect conventions, lots of detail, etc.)

Editing

Are most words spelled correctly?

Are most words spelled correctly? ______ Is the capitalization mostly correct? _____

Is the punctuation mostly correct?

Are the words in the proper tenses? (not switching between past and present tense) Are most of the sentences complete? (No problems with run-ons or fragments)

Did the writer punctuate dialogue correctly and change paragraphs for new speakers?

Did the writer divide the paper into paragraphs in the correct places?

Read over your paper with at least three other people.
